


#### 2021 WA State Energy Strategy

- Align strategy with clean electricity laws
  - Energy Independence Act (I-937, 2006)
  - Clean Energy Transformation Act (SB 5611, 2019)
    - After 2025, no coal in resource mix
    - By 2030, greenhouse neutral electricity supply
    - By 2045, 100% renewable or non-emitting sources
- Align strategy with greenhouse gas emissions limits (HB 2311, 2020)
  - By 2030, 45% below 1990 levels
  - By 2040, 75% below 1990 levels
  - By 2050, 95% below 1990 levels and achieve net-zero emissions.

# **BPS Policy Priorities**

- Must address existing buildings
- Start with the highest energy using buildings
- Use a reference standard
- Site based energy use
- Voluntary first, mandatory follows
- Technical assistance



# Clean buildings – Tier 1

- Performance standards for existing large buildings over 50k sf
  - Energy management
  - Operations and maintenance
  - Benchmarking
  - Targets or investment criteria
  - Exemptions



# Clean buildings – Tier 2

- Buildings between 20-50k sf, including multifamily
- Not a performance standard until 2031
- Focus on benchmarking, energy and operations planning



#### Tier 1- Compliance Schedule

A building owner of a covered commercial building must meet the following reporting schedule for complying with the standard and every five years thereafter:



Buildings over 220,000 GFA, June 1, 2026



Buildings between 90,001 - 220,000 GFA, June 1, 2027



Buildings between 50,000 - 90,000 GFA, June 1, 2028

#### Progress to date

- ✓ Rulemaking completed, <u>WAC 194-50</u> administrative rules, Nov 2020
  - 15 public workshops and comment periods
  - Inclusive and participatory process
- ✓ Building owner notification completed, July 2021
  - 12,000 letters mailed to potential buildings
  - Parcel list posted to website
- ✓ Database developed and released, ongoing
- ✓Incentive program launched, July 2021
- ✓ Outreach and education, ongoing



#### Early Adopter Incentive Program

- Incentivizes high energy users
- Incentive funds are limited to \$75 million
- \$.85 cents per gross square foot
- Equity and inclusion:
  - Rural communities
  - Multifamily affordable housing

# Clean Buildings Portal

- View and verify parcel/building information
- Manage roles and authorized users to work on parcel/building profile
- Submit applications
- Submit compliance forms
- Track compliance requirements
- Check on the status of applications
- Make changes to account information
